RED LAKE WATERSHED DISTRICT Board of Manager's Minutes January 28, 2021

President Dale M. Nelson called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. at the Red Lake Watershed District Office, Thief River Falls, MN.

Present in person: Managers Dale M. Nelson, Allan Page, LeRoy Ose, Terry Sorenson, Gene Tiedemann, and Tom Anderson. Present via Zoom: Brian Dwight. Staff Present: Myron Jesme and Tammy Audette, and Legal Counsel, Delray Sparby.

The Board reviewed the agenda. A motion was made by Ose, seconded by Tiedemann, and passed by unanimous vote that the Board approve the agenda. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed the January 14, 2021 minutes. Motion by Tiedemann, seconded by Sorenson, to approve the January 14, 2021 Board meeting minutes as presented. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed the Financial Report dated January 27, 2021. Motion by Tiedemann, seconded by Dwight, to approve the Financial Report dated January 27, 2021. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed Pay Estimate No. 15 in the amount of \$407,978.83 to R.J. Zavoral & Sons, Inc. for construction of the Thief River Falls Westside Flood Damage Reduction Project, RLWD Project No. 178. Motion by Ose, seconded by Tiedemann, to approve Pay Estimate No. 15 in the amount of \$407,978.83 to R.J. Zavoral & Sons, Inc., for construction of the Thief River Falls Westside Flood Damage Reduction Project, RLWD Project No. 178. Motion carried. Engineer Nate Dalager, HDR Engineering, Inc., discussed Change Order No. 8, which includes unexpected rock blockages that the subcontractor encountered under State Hwy 32 at the intersection of Greenwood Street, while boring a culvert under Highway 32. Dalager discussed the construction sequence chosen by the contractor that was not consistent with sequencing discussed at the preconstruction meeting, which specifically, was the lack of completing the diversion portion of the project prior to the directional bore of the culvert under Highway 32. Dalager stated that because of the sequence chosen by the contractor and due to nuisance rainfall events, the boring area had to be dewatered various times due to the prime contractor's decision to allow water from a six square mile drainage area continue to flow towards the Highway 32 boring site, noting that contractor continued to work with no approval of overages from the District. Dalager stated that he is not able to tell the difference between encountering rock or water removal from the contractor's invoice, stating that the hours the subcontractor submitted should be the responsibility of the prime contractor to control. Dalager also noted that water management is incidental to the work. The contractor is requesting \$85,400, with Dalager recommending payment in the amount of \$30,035.34. Dalager informed the Board that there is a provision in the contract documents that if there is going to be a change order, they need prior approval before moving forward without permission or approval. If the contractor does not agree Dalager's recommendation, the contractor can make a claim. Discussion was held that the staging and sequencing of the project is all on the contractor, and that unknown subsurface conditions are a thing that should be taken into consideration when making a bid. Legal Counsel Sparby stated that he would like to see them break down their costs further. Staff from HDR

Engineering documented work while they were completing the directional bore, and was keeping the City of Thief River Falls, Pennington County and the District aware of the situation. Motion by Dwight, to authorize approval of Change Order No. 8 in the amount of \$30,035.34, to R.J. Zavoral & Sons, Inc., provided the Change Order has the support of the City of Thief Falls. The motion died for a lack of a second. Mark Borseth, City of Thief River Falls, stated that the city was frustrated with the contractor's procedure of starting the boring without having the diversion in place. Sparby asked if this change order was a pass through for the city to pay or are the costs split between entities? Borseth indicated that the city would accept any help the District would give towards the cost of the change order. Motion by Ose, seconded by Tiedemann, to authorize Dalager and Administrator Jesme to negotiate with the contractor in regard to Change Order No. 8, for construction of the Thief River Falls Westside Flood Damage Reduction Project, RLWD Project No. 179 and report back to the Board with their recommendations. Motion passed with Manager Dwight opposed.

Engineer Nate Dalager, HDR Engineering, Inc., stated that the Engineers Report for the Pine Lake Flood Damage Reduction and Fish Habitat Project, RLWD Project No. 26B, was submitted to BWSR and MnDNR for their review. Dalager indicated that a hearing date should be scheduled in the near future. Motion by Ose, seconded by Anderson, to schedule the hearing for the Pine Lake Flood Damage Reduction and Fish Habitat Project, RLWD Project No. 26B, for March 11, 2021 at 10:30 a.m. at the District office. Motion carried. Staff member Nick Olson stated that advertising notice has begun for aeration on Pine Lake, with the Gonvick Sportsman Club monitoring the oxygen levels.

Engineer Tony Nordby, Houston Engineering, Inc., reviewed Change Order No. 1 for construction of the Black River Impoundment, RLWD Project No. 176 in the amount of \$51,564.65. Motion by Page, seconded by Tiedemann, to approve Change Order No. 1 in the amount of \$51,564.65 for construction of the Black River Impoundment, RLWD Project No. 176. Motion carried. Nordby reviewed Pay Estimate No. 5 in the amount of \$45,351.10. Motion by Page, seconded by Ose, to approve Pay Estimate No. 5 for the construction of the Black River Impoundment, RLWD Project No. 176, in the amount of \$45,351.10 to R.J. Zavoral & Sons, Inc. Motion carried. Administrator Jesme and Legal Counsel Sparby are working on easements for the diversion ditches. Jesme indicated that additional verbiage is needed from Sparby prior to submittal to the landowners.

District Manager, Peter Nelson, Pennington SWCD, updated the Board on construction projects for all the LGU's within the Red Lake River 1W1P, RLWD Project No. 149. Nelson and Staff member, Arlene Novak, stated that BWSR recently completed a reconciliation of the first 50% allocation of the 2018 grant, which approves the release of the next 40% of the available funding.

Engineer Tony Nordby, Houston Engineering, Inc., stated that after review of the bids for the Ditch 10 Outlet Repairs, RLWD Project No. 161, Nordby submitted the contract documents to R.J. Zavoral & Sons, Inc. for review.

The Board reviewed a petition from landowners James and Lori Reinbold to allow drainage of approximately 40 acres in the NE ¼ of Section 9, Equality Township, Red Lake County, to be included into the Ditch No. 7, RLWD Project No. 20 benefitted area. Staff member Nick Olson

stated that Reinbold submitted a tile permit, Permit No. 20156, in which a portion of that area currently drains into Judicial County Ditch No. 3. Legal Counsel Sparby noted that the District would need to hold a hearing to allow Reinbold to drain into the Ditch 7, RLWD Project No. 20 benefitted area. Motion by Page, seconded by Tiedemann, to approve the Petition from James and Lori Reinbold to Petition into the Ditch 7, RLWD Project No. 20 benefitted area. Motion carried. Motion by Ose, seconded by Tiedemann, to hold a hearing on April 9, 2021 at 9:30 a.m. at the District office, for the inclusion of land owned by James and Lori Reinbold into the Ditch 7, RLWD Project No. 20 benefitted area. Motion from James at the District office, for the inclusion of land owned by James and Lori Reinbold into the Ditch 7, RLWD Project No. 20 benefitted area.

Staff member Corey Hanson reviewed a proposal for continuation of financial support for the analysis of lake samples collected by the East Polk SWCD. Hanson stated that the East Polk SWCD will collect water quality samples on nine lakes for a monitoring period of three years (2021-2023). The East Polk SWCD contribution is approximately \$8,663.04, which includes staff time, administration, and transportation. The District's contribution would cover the cost of lab testing and shipping at an approximate cost of \$7,290 over the three-year term. Motion by Sorenson, seconded by Dwight, to approve the lake monitoring proposal with the East Polk SWCD at an approximate cost of \$7,290.00 for a three-year term. Motion carried.

MAWD dues for 2021 were presented to the Board. Motion by Tiedemann, seconded by Page, and passed unanimously to approve paying \$7,500 for the 2021 MAWD dues. Motion carried.

Legal Counsel Sparby indicated that Staff member Tammy Audette completed gathering the information to submit to the courts for the appeal on the Polk County Ditch 39 Improvement, RLWD Project No. 179. Sparby will complete a Certification of Record, that will need to be signed by Secretary Ose, prior to submittal to all the parties and the court.

Administrators Update:

- Jesme and Manager Ose participated in the January 19, 2021 RRWMB meeting.
- Jesme and Staff member Olson participated in a telephone conference with BWSR to discuss the PTMApp for the Clearwater River 1W1P. Hanson also participated in a meeting to review the draft Bylaws for the Policy Committee, that will be submitted to each LGU.

February 11, 2021

Red River Watershed Management Board – LeRoy and I will be attending the RRWMB February 16, 2021 via Microsoft Teams. One item they are bringing back from their last meeting it to discuss the future of the Water Quality Funding. I have included in your packet at Red River Basin 2021 Spring Flood Outlook for your review. I have also included the Recommitment to the 1998 RR Basin Mediation Agreement signature page for your review. The RRFDWG asked all original signatories of the 1998 agreement to recommit to the agreement as there has been a large turnaround of employees over time and just wanted to assure all the agencies understand their role in the mediation agreement.

Clearwater River 1W1P – Corey and I attended a telephone conference Monday with BWSR staff and Project Coordinator Chester Power, Clearwater SWCD. The meeting was to discuss budget items and develop a workload for utilizing PTMapp in the upcoming plan now that Ashley is no longer working here. Options include using the material Ashly had accumulated and to budget time between Corey and Houston Engineer staff to complete the process. It was determined that no other Planning Workgroup meeting is needed prior to the upcoming Policy Committee meeting which will be held 1:00 pm Wednesday February 24, 2021. I believe the meeting will be virtual, with more information being made available soon.

Minnesota Pollution Control – I was asked by the MPCA a month or so ago to participate in their "Water Permitting Transparency Focus Group Meeting" held Friday February 5th at 9:00 am. The focus group meeting consisted of gathering various Local Units of Government (LGU) employees who typically use the MPCA general MS4 or Individual Permits. Some of the items discussed is why they require permits and what are the challenges, overview of the various water permitting processes, water quality standards and an overview of process for developing permits limits/conditions. Over-all I think the meeting went well and it was interesting to see what others felt on what MPCA is doing well and what could improve.

Red River 1W1P – There has been a Microsoft Teams meeting set for 1:00 Monday February 22^{nd} to discuss the upcoming RCPP/BWSR funding agreement and if this is an option for 1w1p. It should be interesting to hear how this will work based on the lack of success we had on the Black River Impoundment funding.

Minnesota Association of Watershed District Administrators Meeting – There is a MAWA meeting today from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm. I will be attending that meeting as soon as we are done here. The MAWA Legislative Resolution Committee Meeting (subcommittee of MAWD) scheduled for tomorrow February 12th was canceled. We are looking for another date to hold that meeting.

Office Closed – Just to remind you that the office will be closed on February 15th for Presidents Day.

Bottom Line up Front!


- It's early, but... this outlook starts with a very low threat for *significant* snowmelt flooding, similar to spring 2018.

- Follows record wettest year in 2019, and Top Ten flooding in 2020. *But*, a dry late summer and fall period in 2020 has depleted any residual soil moisture or streamflow.

- Snowfall/SWE at mid-January was well below long term winter season normal amounts.

- Abnormally Dry to Moderate Drought conditions underlay the meager snowpack.

- Frost depths are near normal, as meager snowpack has allowed for deep frost penetration.



- Climate outlooks currently indicate an increased risk for near normal temperatures but a somewhat wetter late winter early spring period, which increases our risk for late season heavy snow or rainfall.

Long Story Short: The risk for significant snowmelt flooding is quite low, running below long-term historical averages across the Red River and Devils Lake Basins (U.S. portions).

Key Snowmelt Flood Components:

1. Base Streamflow: Near to somewhat below average for this time of year. USGS analyses indicate that the Red River and most of its ND and MN tributaries (south of Grafton-Argyle) are moderate ice covered and/or flowing at in the 25% -75% of normal ranges [link: <u>https://waterdata.usgs.gov/nwis/rt</u>]. Tributaries north of Grafton-Argyle at 25%.

2. Soil Moisture at Freeze-up: Near to below average across the Red River Basin, and well below average in the Devils Lake Basin. [Link: <u>https://www.cpc.ncep.noaa.gov/products/Soilmst_Monitoring/US/Soilmst/Soilmst.shtml</u>]

3. Frost Depth: Near normal. A mild early winter but with a very light and/or delayed snowcover has allowed for deep frost penetration in most areas. Frost depths range from 12 to 24 inches in most locations, with some lesser frost depths in upland areas on northwest MN, where snowpack was slightly higher.
